January 2018 ACS NSQIP Semiannual Report

The January 2018 ACS NSQIP Semiannual Reports, with data collected July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017, are now available on the NSQIP Workstation. Collaborative reports from NSIQP are also included in this release. Report walkthroughs and additional materials are available in the Collaborative Resource Toolkit in the Program Resources section of the NSQIP Resource Portal.

<u>Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program – PMPnow</u>

Effective January 2018, new Illinois legislation requires prescribers with a controlled substance license to register with the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP). When initially prescribing a Schedule II narcotic (opioid), prescribers must document in the medical record an attempt to assess the patient's access to controlled substances in the PMP. Hospitals are required to integrate their EHRs with the PMP by 2021. PMPnow allows your electronic health record system to automatically send requests to the PMP. Patient information is then viewable within seconds inside your EHR without logging into the PMP website, saving time and improving efficiency. Southern Illinois University School of Medicine, Northwestern Memorial Hospital, Rush University Medical Center, and Presence Health are among the hospitals who are automating their PMP inquiries.

OSF Healthcare System

OSF HealthCare system, which is comprised of 13 acute care hospitals and 193 clinic site locations, is at the forefront of Illinois healthcare systems working to address the opioid epidemic through multiple system-wide strategies. To encourage patients to properly dispose of unused opioid medications, the OSF HealthCare system has installed secure disposal boxes at all of its hospitals. As Jerry Storm, Senior Vice President of OSF HealthCare Pharmacy Services presented at the ISQIC Annual Meeting, the need for an accessible, on-site safe disposal option was identified through a community hospital needs assessment. Partnerships with local community agencies, law enforcement, and local judicial staff were integral in the implementation process.

Additionally, OSF HealthCare is working to lower default prescription quantities in system-wide surgical order sets. Dr. William Scharf will share more about how this process has looked thus far, including the challenges his team has encountered, on the ISQIC opioid stewardship webinar on March 8th.
